## Pembina Hills Book Award:

Or...How to Get Grade Nines to Actually Read a Book, Amidst a World Filled with Digital Distractions

## Context

$\square$ We are classroom teachers
$\square$ AISI--16 years ago! (Thanks, Judy...)
$\square$ Continued collaboration

## Project Background

$\square$ Observations:
$\square$ Fewer students read for pleasure
$\square$ The literacy skills of our students are declining
$\square$ Stamina is diminishing
$\square$ Students in high school struggle to meet the demands

## Our Guiding Beliefs

$\square$ Reading is important
$\square$ Given the following conditions, grade nines will read:
$\square$ Quality books
$\square \quad$ Limited choice (too much choice is intimidating)
$\square$ Time in class to read
$\square$ Opportunities to share
$\square$ A supportive and enthusiastic environment

## Process: Before

- Before:
$\square$ Preparations and invitations
- 5 schools
- 10 teachers
- 13 diverse grade 9 classes
- 239 students


## Process: During

$\square$ During:

- Baseline measures
- Survey
- Written component

I Introducing the books

- Expectations
- 5 books, 1 novel, 75-90 minutes/week


## Process: After

- After:
- Post-project measures
- Survey
- Business letter
$\square$ Teacher meeting
$\square$ Adjustments for next year
- Add more genres--horror/humour/fantasy
- Start earlier


## Initial Impressions from Data

$\square$ Initially
$\square$ Many students saw themselves as nonreaders
$\square 38 \%$ do not want to read, ever
$\square$ 8\% had not read one book (Sept.-Dec.)

- 60\% had read 1-5 books (Sept.-Dec.)
- 30\% are lapsed readers


## Impressions from Post-Project Data

The majority of students complied with the 5 books, one novel requirement

- $91 \%$ of students say the project should continue
- Every student found at least one book that they enjoyed
- Many students expressed appreciation for being able to participate in the project


## Moving Forward: Next Year

$\square$ Keep the most read titles
$\square$ Add a limited number of titles - mostly novels
$\square$ All participating teachers have been invited to help choose additional books
$\square$ Books have been purchased and provided
